

Police: Girl crashed stolen car while high on marijuana

A 15-year-old girl crashed a stolen car Saturday while under the influence of marijuana, the Hanford Police Department said.

Around 11:46 a.m., officers responded to a traffic crash with an injury at 11th Avenue and Elm Street. Police said a 15-year-old girl driving a stolen white 2009 Saturn Aura failed to negotiate the turn from 11th Avenue onto Elm Street and hit an oncoming blue 2004 Saturn L300.

Police said the girl was evaluated and found to be driving under the influence of marijuana. She was booked into the Kings County Juvenile Center on suspicion of vehicle theft, DUI, possession of stolen property and being an unlicensed driver.

She and her 14-year-old passenger were not injured.

The driver of the other vehicle suffered a shoulder injury and complained of pain, police said. Both vehicles sustained moderate to major damage.
